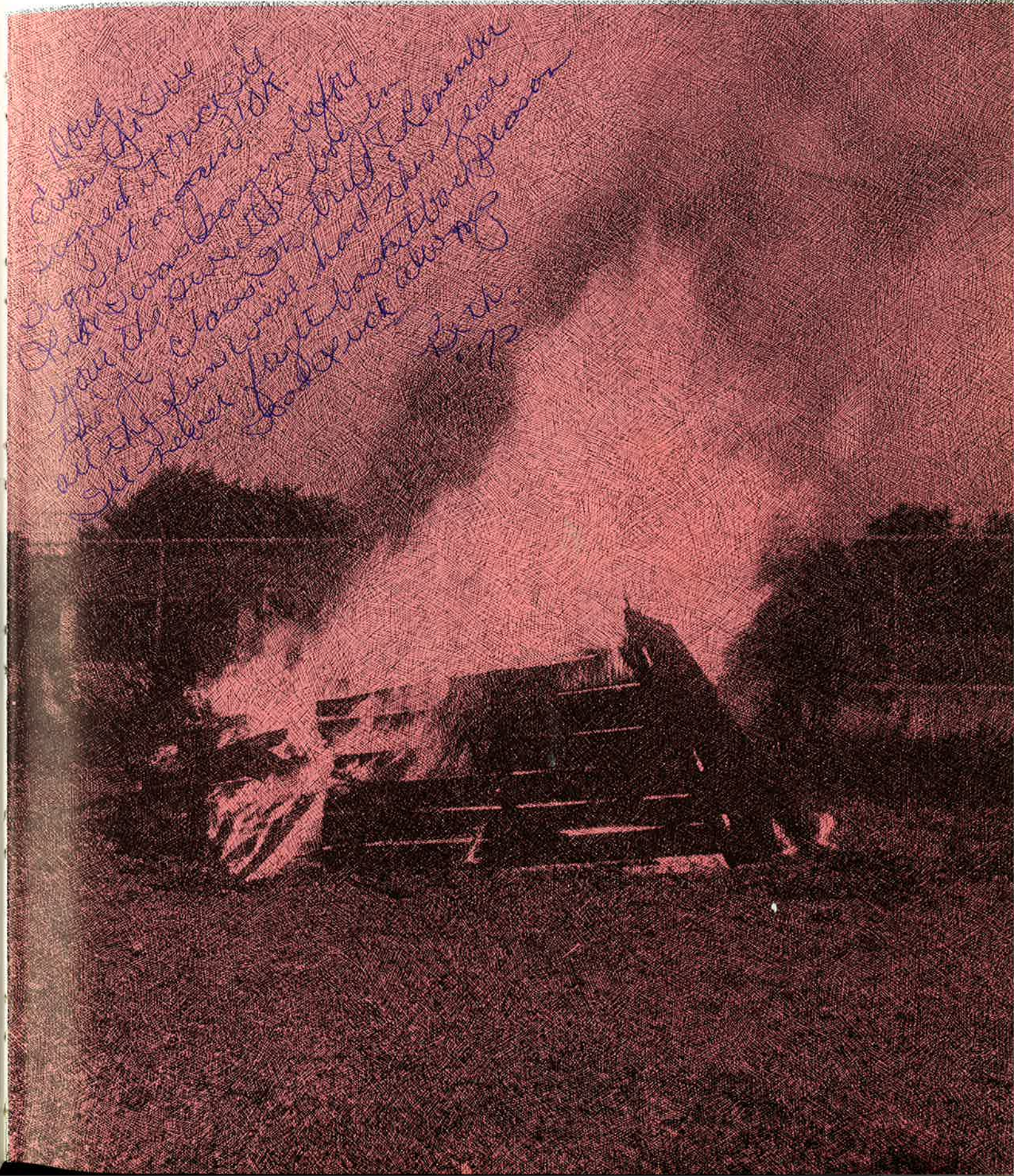
DEDICATION

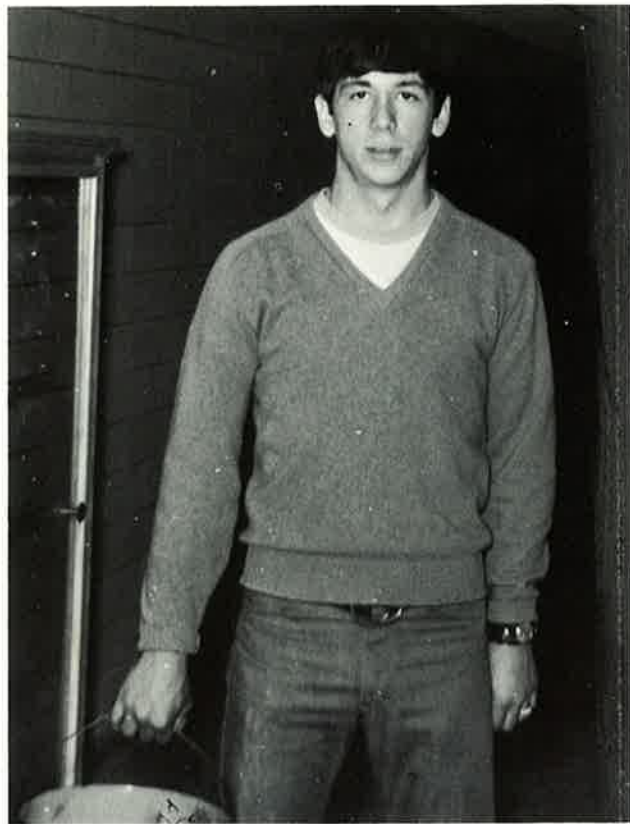


Martha Glezen

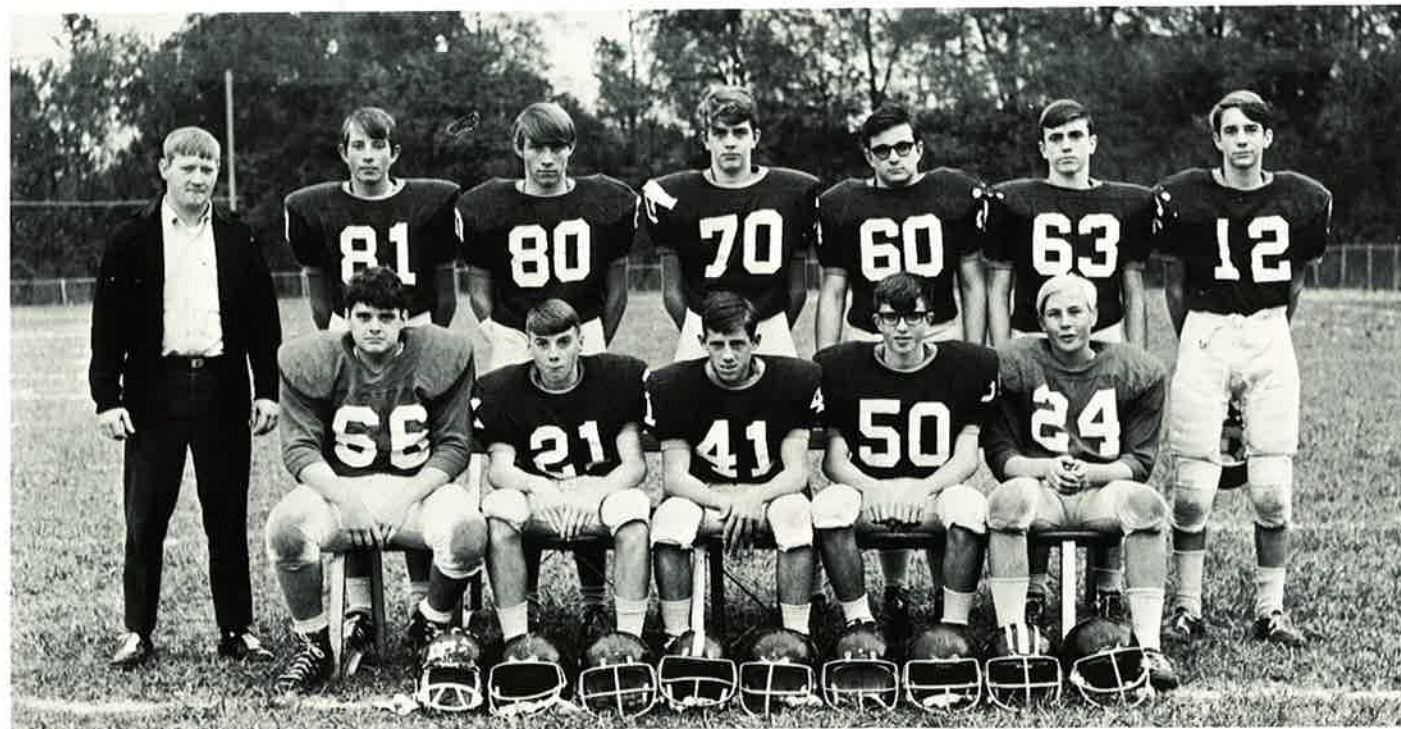

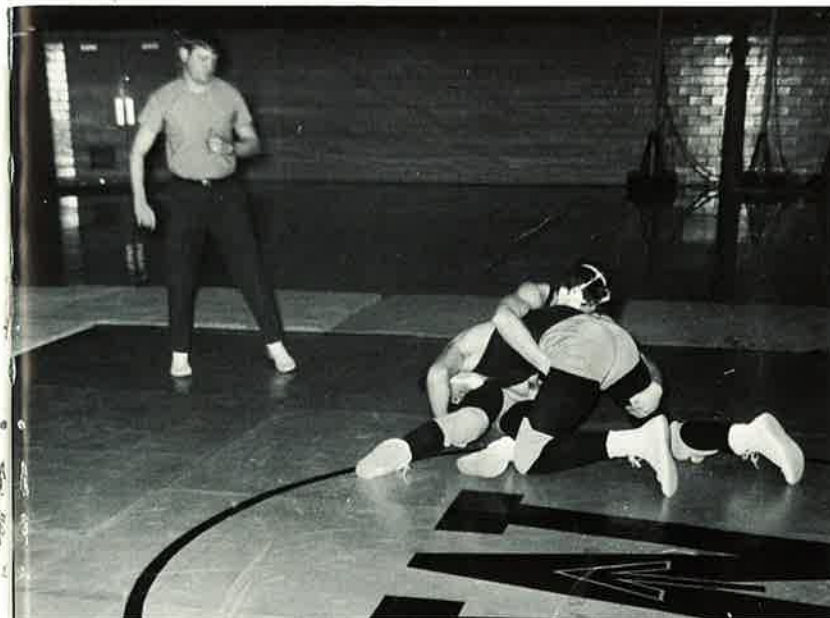

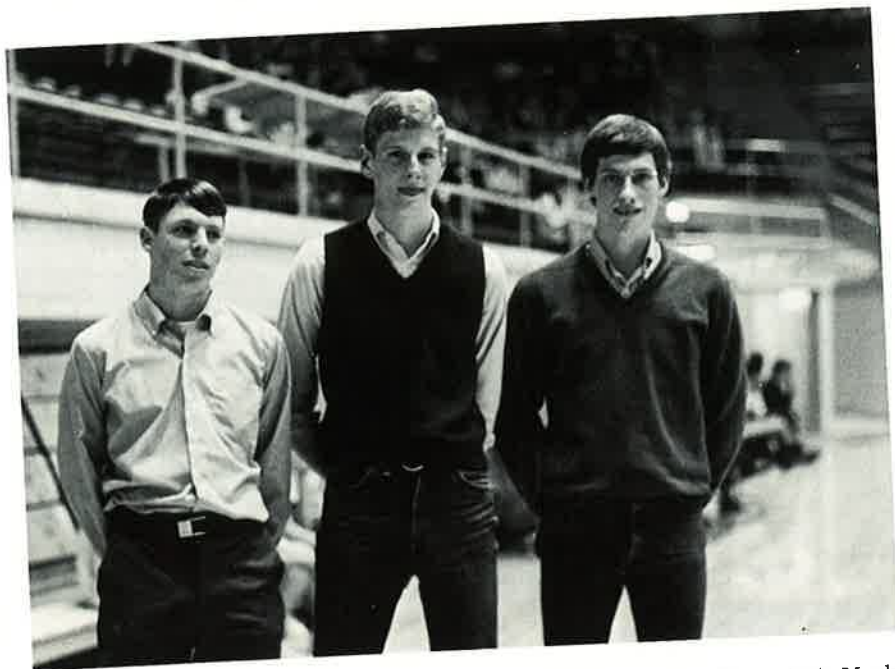

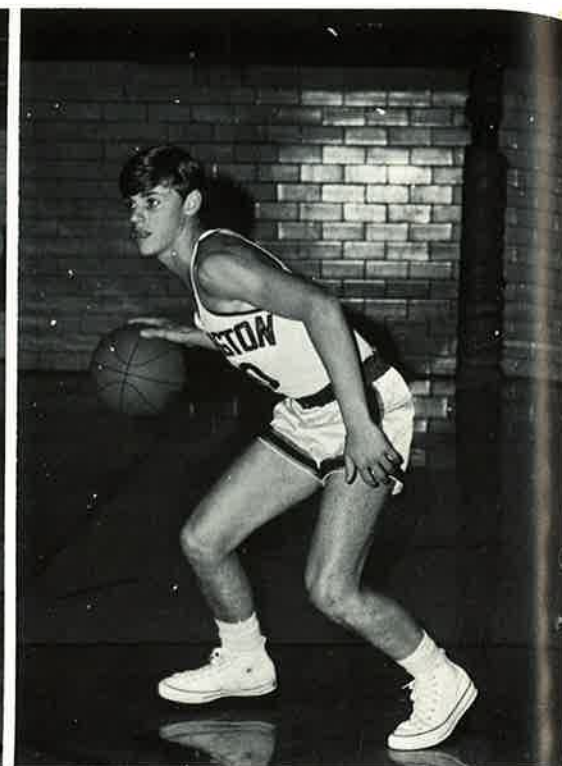

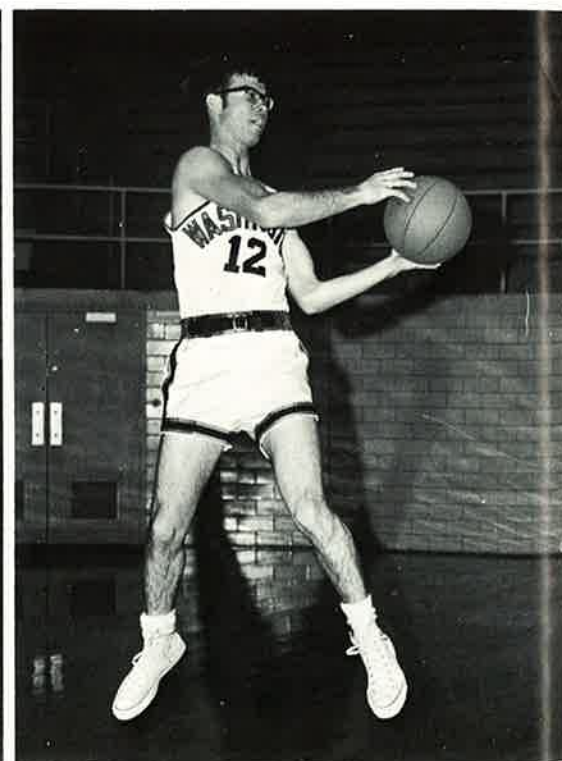

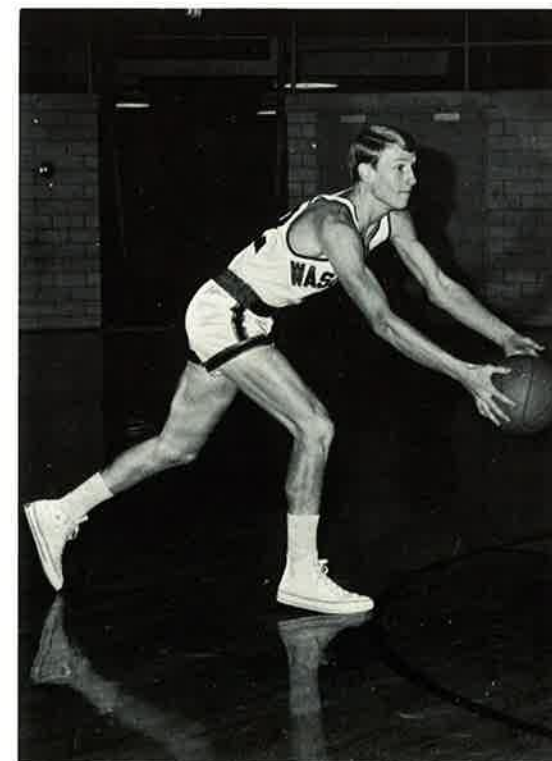

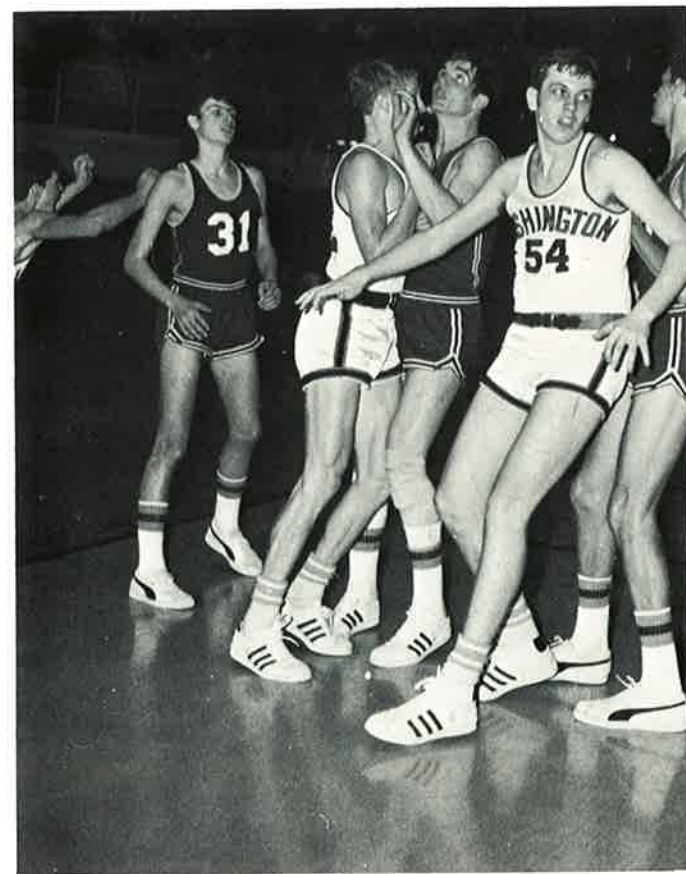

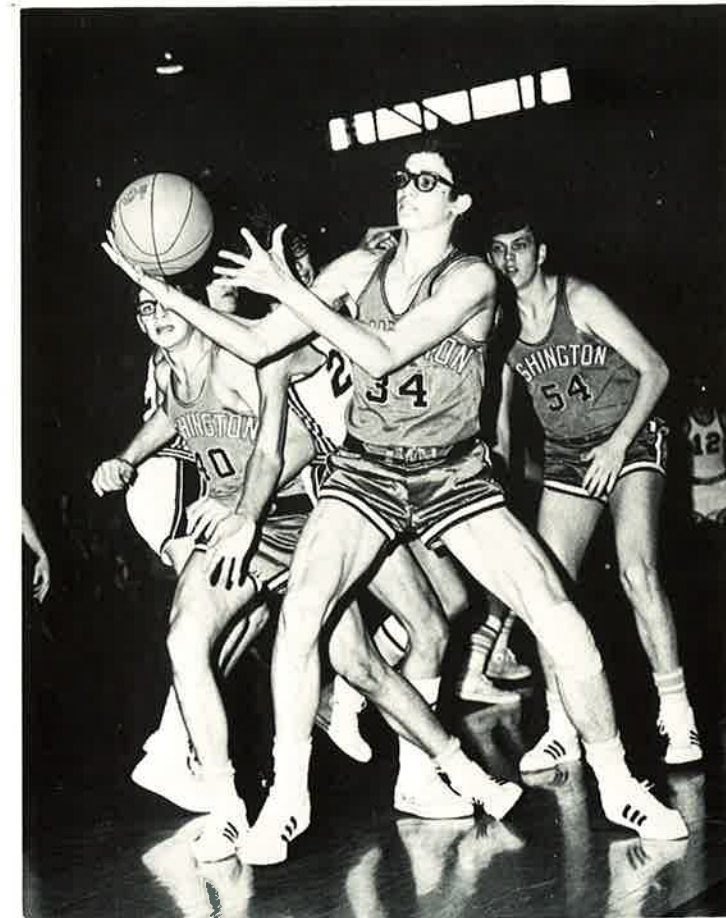

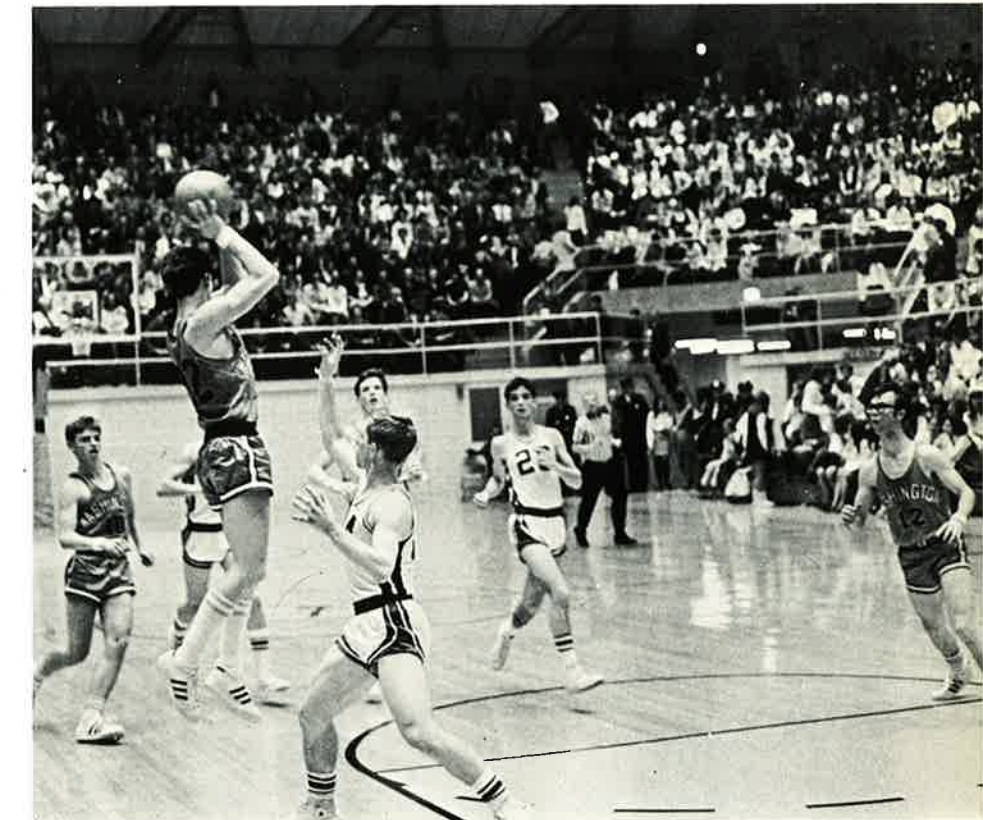
